## Special Session of Earlham City Council October 24, 2022

The Earlham City Council met in Special Session on Monday, October 24, 2022, 7:00 p.m. at Earlham City Hall. Mayor Lillie called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and the following answered roll: Baskin, Fredericksen, Mudge, Nelsen, Swalla. Also present: Clerk Hibbs; Travis Squires, financial advisor with Piper Sandler

1. Approval of Agenda

Motion by Baskin, second by Fredericksen, to approve agenda.

2. Public Hearing on the authorization of a Loan and Disbursement Agreement and the issuance of notes to evidence the obligation of the City thereunder.

Travis Squire explained the differences between 20-year and 30-year loans. He had thought we would be able to get the 30-year note at the same interest rate as the 20, but this is not the case. Council was looking at a 30-year in order to prevent a double figure rate increase. Squires now feels we could do the 20-year loan with a 6% increase in sewer rate for FY23-24 and FY24-25, and then a 3% increase annually following, and we would be able to qualify for the loan. Council agreed this would be the best option for both the City and the citizens

Motion by Baskin, second by Fredericksen, to approve Ordinance No 439 Amending the Earlham Code of Ordinances, Chapter 99 Sewer Service Charges.
